This is the time when we must seek out those prophetic words for our churches and for our individual lives. The harvest is ripe. So many are searching and





In the late '90s a friend talked me into accompanying her to the Victory Women's Conference in Sriracha, Thailand. Being unfamiliar with the laying on of hands, speaking in tongues etc. I resolved to be fully on my guard. What followed changed my life forever. As I sat in the audience my spirit was gripped by the preaching of a speaker I had never heard of previously. Dr. Hazel Hill was speaking with a power, an authority and a faith I had not encountered before. My own faith soared, and kept soaring for the next two years.

Fast forward several years later, and my husband and I found ourselves moving jobs, homes, and countries yet again. We had also come to a point where we needed to decide what our next step would be in dealing with the infertility problem we had been struggling with for the past fifteen years. We had studied the Word, prayed, and sought medical help, but got no closer to having children. I kept checking with my spirit as to how to proceed. What I felt being impressed upon my spirit was to go ahead with the next medical step, which was in vitro fertilization. I felt strongly that my conscience as a believer was at peace, and my husband felt the same way.



Around this time I wrote to Dr. Hazel and simply asked if she would pray for me, not going into much detail. I'm so glad she did pray, because what followed was more than my faith alone could handle.

Our first round of IVF produced only two embryos and we were thrilled to find out that both of them resulted in my first pregnancy.


At a routine appointment several weeks later, it was discovered that I was not carrying twins, as previously told, but triplets (one of the embryos had split in two).

At that very moment someone else might have recognized the multiple blessing which was given to us, but my whole being went into shock, and fear gripped me with a force, such as I had never experienced before. I sank so far, that for weeks I was unable to utter a prayer, or pick up my Bible. It was a truly dark moment in my spiritual life. The only glimmer of hope was the knowledge that Dr. Hazel was praying. I somehow knew I could trust her faith at the time when I wondered if I had any of my own left.

Prepare Him Room

It is difficult for the best of us to not be swept up into the Christmas flurry. But if we are not careful, the very sights and sounds that are intended to magnify God, can be the very things that distract us from the peace He came to offer. Romans 12:2 warns us, "Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit

into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God" (MSG). What a reminder for us as Christian mothers to purposefully fix our eyes and lift the gaze of our children away from presents, stockings and Santa Claus and onto what matters the most at Christmas time and all the time; Jesus!

Here are three practical tools that you may find helpful:

### 1. Celebrate Big!

As Christians we have the privilege of celebrating even louder and longer than the rest of the world! In our home, we've presented Christmas to our children as 'the biggest birthday party on the whole planet'. Not only is celebrating Jesus fun for your children, it also combats the sinful inclination toward greed and entitlement! As you decorate your home with lights, and dress the Christmas tree or as you bake together and shop for gifts for loved ones, remind your children that it's not just done for the people we love, it's ALL for the One whom you're celebrating! Our God is so awesome that when He has a birthday, EVERYONE gets presents! Wow, what a good God. Another good practice to weave into gift giving, is to ask your children what gift they can give to Jesus. After all, the greatest gift we can give is our lives. What a perfect opportunity to instruct those impressionable hearts!

### 2. Slow Down and Look Around!

I remember the look in my son's eyes when he saw snow for the first time. I was rushing to transport him out of the cold

and into the car when I heard him squeal with delight.

I looked to see his eyes wide in wonder as he took in the view. He was eight months old, but his contagious enthusiasm stopped me in my tracks and my eyes were open to see the beauty that was all around! If we're not careful, we can be so distracted by our busy to-do lists and social gatherings that we forget to look around and see the wonder of it all! Often the most sacred things can be passed over unless we have eyes to see! Ask yourself, if what you're doing is adding or distracting to the view of Jesus. Having the best light-show on the block may build egos, but singing Christmas carols over candle-light will feed the very soul.

### 3. Count it Down

Advent is a Christian practice of expectant waiting and anticipation of Christmas day, as well as a tremendous way to daily focus on Jesus. We have a nativity that is separated into 25 different pieces with scripture readings. Each day we unwrap and add to our nativity display. On Christmas morning we unwrap the greatest gift, baby Jesus. Whether you choose to do something similar, or adapt a way of your own, this is an easy way to walk through the Holidays purposefully. Some people wrap up 25 Christmas books and unwrap one a day, some just do simple devotional readings or crafts. Counting down the days is a way to prepare room in the hearts of our young ones. Rather than emphasising 'being a good boy/girl so Santa will bring presents, Advent empties 'self' to recognize that Jesus is the gift we don't deserve. He doesn't love us more if we're good, He doesn't forsake us if we are bad. He is the gift we have already

been given and we can unwrap every day!

Remember that a Christ-centered home doesn't accidentally happen. We must choose to intentionally teach our children that God's presence is available to us today. Look for symbols that echo Christ's love. The sharp needles on the tree, symbolizing how Jesus was pierced for our iniquities, the presents below, reminding us that His presence always surrounds us! He is our Emmanuel, God with us! Be blessed as you prepare Him room!





Gingerbread Trifle Recipe

With family gatherings and Christmas parties abounding during this holiday season, I find myself looking for a great recipe that I can use for church potlucks or get togethers with family and friends. This trifle is delicious, made with gingerbread cake and warm apples & cranberries. It is

equally good made a few hours ahead and chilled or served hot and fresh. This recipe serves eight or can be multiplied to use for a larger party.

### For the Gingerbread Cake

1/2 cup (4 oz.) unsalted butter, at room temperature; more for the pan

1-1/2 cups (6-3/4 oz.) unbleached all-purpose flour

2 tsp. ground ginger

1 tsp. ground cinnamon

1/2 tsp. baking soda

1/4 tsp. ground cloves

1/4 tsp. table salt

1 Tbs. grated fresh ginger

1/4 cup granulated sugar

1/4 cup packed dark brown sugar

1 large egg, at room temperature

1/2 cup unsulfured mild molasses

1/2 cup buttermilk, at room temperature

Position a rack in the center of the oven and heat the oven to 350°F. Butter the sides of an 8x8-inch square cake pan and line the bottom of the pan with parchment. In a medium bowl, mix the flour, ground ginger, cinnamon, baking soda, cloves, and salt. Set aside.



Using a hand mixer or a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, beat the butter on medium speed until light and fluffy, about 1 minute. Add the fresh ginger and mix until just combined. Add both sugars and beat on medium speed until well combined and fluffy, about 1 minute. Stop the mixer and scrape down the sides of the bowl. Add the egg and mix on medium speed until well combined. Turn the mixer to low and slowly add the molasses. Add about one-third of the dry ingredients and mix until just combined. Add one-third of the buttermilk and mix until just combined. Add the remaining dry and wet ingredients in four more additions, finishing with the buttermilk and mixing until just combined after each addition. Scrape the batter into the cake pan and spread it evenly.

Bake the cake until a skewer inserted into the center comes out clean, 30 to 35 minutes.

Let the cake cool completely in the pan, at least an hour.

### For the Apples and Cranberries

3 Tbs. unsalted butter

1 & 1/2 lb. Granny Smith apples (about 4 small), peeled and cut into large dice

1/4 tsp salt

1 & 1/2 cups fresh (or frozen) cranberries

1/2 cup pure maple syrup

1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon

1/2 Tbs. freshly grated ginger

Whipped Cream/Devonshire Custurd

In a skillet, sauté apples, cranberries, butter, salt, maple syrup, cinnamon and ginger with a 3Tbsp of water. Let it reduce slightly to form a syrup mixture.

### Assemble:

Cut the ginger cake into cubes. Layer cake whipped cream or custard and fruit mixture into a serving dish or individual glasses. Remember that whipped cream will melt if layered with a hot mixture.

### Make Ahead Tips:

The cake can be made a day ahead and stored at room temperature.
